"An even more dramatic case occurred at 4:10 AM on September 7, 1984, in Minsk. Two military pilots saw an object that hit them with a beam of light. One of the pilots died; the other managed to land the plane, although he had also suffered psychological effects from the light." UFO Chronicles of the Soviet Union, Ballantine, 1992, pp. 128-9. Vallee wrote that he learned the story from Yevgeniy Kolessov in Jan 1990 during visit to the 'Kosmos' pavilion at the 'VDNKh' exhibits park in northern Moscow.

On page 201 he categorizes the case as an encounter"as a result of which witnesses suffer significant injury or death -- one of only three in Russian UFO history." The story is based on "firsthand personal interview with the witness by a source of proven reliability," with the "site visited by a skilled analyst," and in conclusion "no natural explanation possible, given the evidence."


1967: "Flying crescents" over the SE Ukraine, Volga Valley, Caucasus



Motion was silent and, most strikingly to the hundreds of witnesses who filed reports, was horizontal -- flat & level. Often a bright star preceded the 'half-moon shaped' UFO.

The phenomenon repeated itself on July 17, July 31, August 8, September 19 & 22, October 18 & 28, and then just seemed to stop.

Top Soviet scientists later concluded that no known natural or manmade stimulus could account for these unique "anomalous atmospheric phenomena."











Witness analogy (above) matches closely to rocket launch witness sketch from same angle (below)






Immediate implications of Scandinavian sightings

- 1. Witnesses did NOT report UFO in direction of the witnesses on airliners near Minsk ("southeast")
- 2. Narrative features (bright light, cloud, timing and motion, even ground illumination) establish same identity of stimulus
- 3. All interpretations of UFO close proximity to Minsk witnesses can be shown as misinterpretations
- 4. All interpretations that the UFO was local to witnesses and responding specifically to them can be shown to be baseless
- 5. Plesetsk cosmodrome NOT likely as stimulus point of origin


By the mid-1990s, the no-longer-controlled Russian news media had published many additional examples of witness sketches






One rocket launch in particular, on Oct 2, 1991, had been seen widely and sketched. Those images could be compared with the now-available Minsk/4:10 sketches
